Survivors of Suicide Six-Week Bereavement Group

CC Cares is a peer-based program for those newly bereaved by suicide from those who have been there.

You or a loved one - who is within six months of the death - can request a care package and/or a grief companion for support during this difficult time.





Care Package

Crisis Connections carefully crafts a care package that includes materials on grief after a suicide, as well as comfort items found to be helpful by other survivors of suicide loss

These care packages are currently available for free to families living in Washington State.



Companion Mentor

Our companion mentors are suicide loss survivors who offer phonebased support to those newly bereaved by a suicide death. We do our best to match the new survivor to our trained companions based on the relationship of their loss.
